Judges Evaluators Technical (JET) Committee Report

- Competitions: Unfortunately, we were not able to hold any competitions this year due to COVID and logistics. We did have 3 NS officials participate in the new virtual competitions. Sheila Beard, Gregor MacLean & Sarah Miles were trained and then officiated at the NB Sectionals in December 2020. Sheila & Gregor were officials for the Canadian Challenge competition held in January 2021 over 2 weekends.
- The Team Challenge event has been going strong each month (January, February, March & April) and they have been well attended, as 1500 ribbons been sent out with 1 last event to be judged. The skaters have been having fun with these as have been creating team names and matching outfits. Skaters of all levels from across the province have participated in this event. Big thanks to Jill for compiling the entries, hosting us at her home for the judging and then getting the ribbons out to the skaters.
- We had one Region submit programs for video monitoring. 6 skaters/8 programs – Star 5, 9, 10 & Juvenile. Had a panel of 2 technical and 3 judges watch programs and then gather for a zoom call to review and compile feedback to send back to coach and skaters. We all felt that this was beneficial for the skaters to simulate a competition including their competition dress to keep progressing with their training. Also appreciated by the officials to keep their skills and technical knowledge up to date.
- Skate Canada hosted a Pairs Technical Panel Training Seminar in a virtual format in October 2020 and Gregor MacLean participated. Congratulations on successfully achieving phase 1 TC Pairs status.
- We have had 3 new officials move to our province over the last year but have not had a chance to put their skills to use due to lack of competitions, hopeful that the

2021-2022 season will be different. They are all levels: Star 1-4, Juvenile and Senior.

- We have completed the virtual seminars for evaluator training (Star 6 – Gold) and have 1 new evaluator (congratulations to Treena Landry), 2 more have completed the online training. Training will be completed once then can attend Assessment days and do their mentored assessments. We do have an additional evaluator previously Primary who has completed the seminar through the NB Section. This is something that National is working on to have all sections in Canada to be able to have evaluators/judges come together virtually to get whichever training they need or are interested in.
- We have received requests from 3 coaches to be certified as Coach Assessors for Star 6-Gold skills, 1 completed and 2 to complete the mentored assessment process when Assessment days are in their area.
- We have been very lucky in NS to have skaters on the ice and evaluators trained and allowed into the arenas to do in person Assessment days. The rest of Canada has not had the same success. We have had 2 evaluators very busy completing virtual Assessment days, which are a lot of extra administrative work on top of the time doing the tests. Sheila Beard (part of the Skate Canada Virtual Pilot working group) and Sarah Miles are very much appreciated for completing these from coast to coast as some areas have had very few if any test days since the new Star 6-Gold program started.
