ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE

Entrants in events shall be members in good standing of Skate Canada

Skaters who have entered STAR 4 Freeskate events are not eligible for Star 2 or Star 3 Freeskate events.

Synchro Star 3 and Star 2/3 Pattern Dance events are open to all skaters who have passed Star 1 and not passed any part of the Star 5 assessments.

ENTRIES AND FEES

REGISTRATION WILL BE LIVE January 18 to 22, 2024 at skatecanadans.uplifterinc.com. All entries must be completed online through the Skate Nova Scotia Uplifter link. NO late entries will be accepted. NO refunds will be issued for any reason including medical. Entries are accepted on a first come first served basis and if the competition is full registration will be closed without notice and a wait list generated. *Registering on your cell phone is not advised as the program is not designed to work with that format.*

If the competition closes before the deadline and a skater(s) is on the wait list through Uplifter, they will be given priority for the next Star 1-3 competition. The skater must be on the wait list for this competition to be eligible for priority for entry to the next Star 1-3.

Entry fees are:

STAR 1	\$100.00 per skater
STAR 2	\$140.00 per skater
STAR 3	\$140.00 per skater
Special Olympics	\$140.00 per skater
STAR 2/3 Pattern Dance	\$100.00 per skater/team
Synchro Star 3	\$75 per team

Payment by credit card only at the time of registration. **Late entries will not be accepted. Refunds will not be issued.** *Entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis.*

Should this competition be cancelled for any reason, an administration fee will be retained (\$25.00) and deducted from the returning entry fees.

TO REGISTER WITH UPLIFTER YOU WILL NEED:

- Skate Canada Number
- Home Club
- Coach information with email
- Skater category – confirm with coach
- Music in an MP3 format- music file must have skater full name and category for Star 2 or 3 events and Special Olympic events
- Credit card information

Registering with Uplifter:

- Go to skatecanadans.uplifterinc.com
- You will be asked to set up an account if you do not already have one. The message you will see is “You must login or create an account to register for events.”
- As you are registering at the bottom of the page you will see “Message Lists” click yes to all, to make sure that you will receive e-mails regarding the schedule and order of skate.
- Now register each of the skaters in your family
- Once all the skaters in your family are added you can then proceed to the black banner with 2024 STAR 1-3 Greenwood
- On the registration page click on the category you are looking for and then click on REGISTER for that event
- Click on the category, fill in the necessary information, you will need your music in a MP3 format labeled with your skater’s full name and category if you are registering for STAR 2, STAR 3 or Special Olympic.

- All requests for change of categories must be sent by the coach to Sheila Beard shbeard58@gmail.com within 48 hours of the skater lists being circulated with the parent copied on the email. A confirmation email will be sent when the change has been made. Notice of withdrawals prior to the competition must be sent to Sheila Beard shbeard58@gmail.com

AWARDS

STAR 1 to 3 and Special Olympics categories: certificates and ribbons will be presented to all skaters. Synchro element teams will receive ribbons.

SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

A tentative list of skaters will be sent out following the close of registration. Skaters have 48 hours to notify of incorrect event. The competition will not run more than 30 minutes early and will resume on time after each flood.

PATTERN DANCE:	STAR 2/3 – Dutch Waltz – Partnered or Solo
SPECIAL OLYMPICS	OPEN

Star 3 Synchro Elements	teams may consist of 4 to 12 skaters Linear element (block) Linear element (line) Intersection element Rotating element (circle or wheel) Pivoting element
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REGISTRATION

Registration will take place throughout the day at the arena. Time of registration will begin 1 hour before the competition.

MUSIC

GENERAL

- All music used must be in the public domain or covered by the Performing Rights Society.
- All music will be uploaded in a MP3 format at the time of registration in Uplifter
- A backup USB stick, labelled with the skater's name and category should be at rink side with the coach

COACHES ACCREDITATION

Coaches must be a minimum of NCCP Regional Coach Trained and must be a current Professional Coaching Member of Skate Canada in Good Standing.

Coaches not in good standing will not be permitted at ice level. All Coaches must ensure that they have proof of Skate Canada Registration during the competition.

DISCLAIMER
